



Before the Parking Authority of Baltimore City existed...


City owned garages had a reputation for being dangerous, dirty & poorly maintained, and parking meters and their rates had gone unchanged since they were installed.

But 15 years ago, that began to change...





- Mayor & Baltimore City Council passes Ordinance 2000-71 creating the Parking Authority



- PABC begins operations

- Office moved to current location in street level retail space with walk-in customer service desk
- 6 garages converted to cashierless operations
- Online renewal system launched for residential permits



- 70 EZ Park Meters that accept credit cards introduced

- 11 of 14 garages become fully automated
- Current Executive Director hired
- Garage upgrades made to flooring, elevators, lighting & security
- Monthly garage parkers can begin using credit cards



- Fleet & Eden Garage built & opened - PABC reauthorized by the Mayor & City Council. Sunset clause removed.

expanding EZ Park Meter program

- First in the US chip coin pay on foot system launched at 3 city




- 39 Residential Permit Parking areas
 - City owned garages undergo structural surveys by structural engineering firm
 - Bike racks installed at Penn Station Garage & toppers added to parking meter poles to create more bike parking
 - First full-time employee hired for Reserved Residential Handicapped Parking Program



- Emails sent to RPP customers with renewal information
- Planning division created
- Bike Parking Room added to Lexington Street Garage
- PABC adds tables & chairs, umbrellas and plantings to Penn Station Plaza
- Partnered with Mayor's Commission on Disabilities to combat abuse of disability placards



- Valet regulations bill passed
- Motor Coach Parking Facility opened that allows RV's, motorcoaches and tour buses to park off street with lounge for drivers
- Stairwells improved and roof repaired at West Street Garage
- Expansion joints & traffic coating repaired at Arena Garage
- PABC assists with placement of 79 Zipcars, 11 of which are in food deserts



- 783 EZ Park Meters
- Electric Vehicle charging stations added to 8 City owned parking garages
- 64% of Zipcar Baltimore members got rid of a car or avoided purchasing a car

- Reverse angle parking introduced in

Hampden, adding 125 spaces

- City owned garages are models of cleanliness & safety

- 5 new City owned garages are

- 3,407 lighting fixtures replaced in garages with brighter, more energy efficient bulbs
- Bicycle parking added to 5 garages
- PABC supports launch of Charm City Circulator with stops near 6 City owned garages



- 713 EZ Park Meters creating 700 additional parking spaces
- 1,476 Reserved Residential Handicap Parking spaces
- 41 RPP areas and 30,857 permits issued
- Reserved Residential Handicap Parking space application process reduced from 6-18 months to less than 30 days
